1. Cap Badge (rare!!) backed in plastic (red), bronze badge – what looks like Israeli writing – an upright dagger with olive branch surrounded by laurel wreath. We need someone to identify it as we do not know where it has come from.
2. Art deco (Jack Duckworth) cocktail cabinet, in walnut, a superb piece of furniture
3. Art deco walnut table
4. Box of glass photo negatives – some naval, very old
5. Small porthole
6. Square brass porthole (cracker!) – what a talking piece in a front door, it would provide ventilation and a mail slot
7. About 25 County and Western LP's – mainly Johnny Cash – good collection
8. Hundreds of photos of Marilyn Monroe – large – 5 types – also cinema cards and a French cinema programme of “Some like it hot” – all collectable
9. Selection of Samurai swords
10. “Ozzy” – 3 foot high wooden carved baseball player – needs sanding and a new coat of paint but he's very friendly like me – likes a pat on the head!
11. Oak wine rack and herb stand – go in any kitchen
12. Lamp for bike, War Department issue (blackout model)
13. Morse lamp, War Department issue
14. Train lamp, War Department issue (perfect condition)
15. A selection of LMS Train tools
16. A gorgeous china biscuit barrel with flower motifs on it, it has an EPNS - top don't miss it
17. Two jolly jack tars in brass – about 10” high – would sit nicely either side of the fireplace
18. Have you got a big house? We have some former public house lights – very large – would grace a driveway – if you don't alter the signage you will have plenty of visitors!
19. A few British Army cap badges

20. A grenadier guard's belt buckle
21. Complete series of Falklands war magazines, 14 of them by Marshal Cavendish - if you were in the Falklands you could be featured
22. The brass steering wheel from Rhyl's old lifeboat
23. A brass propeller
24. Two brass shells (we think 4") fired from HMCS Frazer and the firing pin that fired them
25. Two 6" brass soldier's imperial guard (Napoleon) – have faces like frogs!
26. Royal Navy Morse Code Key (tapper) – a beauty
27. Two framed pencil drawings of Belsen concentration camp – quite harrowing
28. Assorted golf equipment
29. Prismatic compasses
30. Two brass bells, one large and a smaller one (reproductions)
31. Two handed engineer's saw issued to our Royal Engineers – get the lady on the other end and saw down all the trees in the garden!
32. Boat anchor (steel), very heavy
33. Field telephone, black bakerlight
34. Sea chest, 38" long, 22" high, 20" depth, tin lined, brass plaque with 'J Macdonald' on lid in pine, a gorgeous piece of furniture
35. Shells, brass assorted, big ones, small ones, engraved with badges on – some real works of art
36. Coal clock made from a 12" x 8" lump of coal (previous owner A Scargill!)
37. Shell lighter, 6" high shell turned into a table lighter
38. Colt pistol, replica
39. Accordion in box – it's a beauty
40. Two East German Airforce caps
41. Lithograph map of Sudan drawn from a hot air balloon, a real piece of history
42. Aneroid barometer in case, brass, terrific example
43. Two Nelson prints: 1 of Nelson dining with Emma Hamilton and 1 of Battle of Trafalgar, very large, ideal for large house or pub
44. Two Black Thorn walking sticks, matching pair, a fine example
45. Assorted nautical prints in sets of 6, 4 or 2, from £20 to £400
46. Shell bell, yes they made this shell into a bell, ideal for an association with corps badge added

47. Leather two seater settee
48. Royal Welsh Fusiliers Bugle
49. 1930's portable radio complete with valves and Marconi batteries in superb leather case
50. ARP Warden's Tin Helmet from WWII marked inside with the owner's name and town (Holywell)
51. Model of the Cutty Sark in glass case, 38" long, 25" high and 17" deep
52. Corps Belt, Royal Marines
53. Pair of White Gloves
54. Pair of Leather Gloves
55. Pair of 42 Commando Garters
56. Pair of 45 Commando Garters
57. Set of RM Collar Dogs
58. Set of Cap Badges in brass
59. 42 Commando Lanyard
60. Green Beret
61. Set of No 1 Blues with 2 good conduct badges and general service medal ribbon
62. Set of No 2 Blues
63. Sets of Olives with general service medal ribbon
64. Olive Raincoat
65. RM Battle Dress with Commando shoulder flash and RM dagger
